General Information

Two Troops working the event per day, so only the first 10 Troops to confirm will participate.

Fundraising money will be split evenly among the troops that participate.

Camp out the night before, on the Izaak Walton League property (off Guyanoga Rd.) While there is no charge for the use of the property, owners would like a donation or for the scouts to do a service project. Still working the details, but I would like to do some kind of service project.

Having enough scouts so that they can take turns working and watching the events would be a good idea, as well as having enough leaders to work with the Scouts.

An area, near parking, will be reserved for the Scouts use. Making lunch, resting, *etc.*

Note that Greg Elling (Scoutmaster and PYRO president) and I will also be camping on the Izaak Walton League property.

Rough Schedule:

- Time: Afternoon, day before. Arrive and setup camp. Have fun and possibly work on service project.
- Time: *TBD*. Get up, have breakfast and pack up camp, unless staying a second night.
- Time: *TBD*. Drive to Potter launch site, about 10 minutes away. Troop 'A' works parking, while Troop 'B' works the fundraiser booth.
- Time: Noon. Lunch. Will have to figure out eating in shifts to make sure fundraiser booth and parking lot are taken care of.
- Time: After lunch. Troop 'A' works fundraiser booth, while Troop B works the parking. As parking duties should be minimal, Troop 'B' will also make a sweep of the main area, doing a litter patrol.
- Time: *TBD*. Help pack up and go home
